
LURITJA LADIES

The Western Desert is coming to Hobart this May when Art Mob launches 'Luritja Ladies', an exhibition of some of the finest female artists to come out of Luritja country. Located to the west and south of Alice Springs, Luritja is of major historical importance, being home to Papunya, the birthplace of the Aboriginal dot movement. This show celebrates this important history by featuring one of the first female dot artists, Pansy Napangardi, who was taught as a young girl by the first dot painting men of Papunya. Also featuring are renowned artists Gabriella Possum, Mavis Nampitjinpa, Fabrianne Nampitjinpa Peterson and many others.






